Dear Year 13,

Recently we have moved back into a national lockdown because of the rising number of Covid-19 cases and hospital admissions. This means that all schools have been asked to switch to remote learning until at least the February half term.

I know this is all incredibly unsettling for you and may leave you feeling very uncertain. I would like to assure you of a few things. The knowledge you are learning in all of your subjects remains very important and useful to you. You will use this knowledge in life (because knowledge is good), in your studies beyond school (either at university or in your career), but more immediately you will still be using and applying this knowledge for the remainder of Year 13 to demonstrate your ability in each subject.

The Prime Minister also said that summer exams will not go ahead as had originally been planned; however, there is no detail at this time as to what will replace them and what this will look like.

We know we will be asked to provide evidence of your progress, and what information you have retained over the past months. With this in mind we are going to ask your teachers, where appropriate, to carry out these assessments. Each teacher will decide on the best method for their subject, and will tell you what this will be beforehand.

- Assessments will start the week beginning 25th January for two weeks
- Assessments will take place during your live lessons
- Please check your Teams calendar for further information and check with your subject teachers during lessons for further instructions

We will plan to sit full mocks when we are back in school. However, we do not know exactly when we will return to school, and we do not yet know what will be needed in place of exams to generate your grades accurately.

Please do not feel that all of your hard work and preparation for your exams over the last two years has been a waste of time; it is quite the opposite. The government are currently coming up with a system to generate students' grades. Whatever they decide upon and whatever testing takes place instead of summer examinations, knowing your subjects well puts you in a strong position.



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For these reasons, and for your wellbeing in general, it is important that you continue to engage with remote learning.

For those of you concerned about your UCAS applications, these are continuing as normal and universities are also putting plans in place to help and support you.

All the staff here at school are thinking of you at this very difficult time. If you are experiencing any feelings that you are struggling to manage, please do contact your Tutor or Head of Year so that you can receive the support you need.
